Any representative of the government of pm or head of state if they go on a foreign tour he must go among the overseas Indians living in that country. this creates a sense of belongingness in the mind of the Diaspora and attracts them to India. Since 2015 AD the government organizes them PBD conferences with the participation of experiate experts, policymakers and interest holders. post subject matter best PBD conference was held in 2021. the theme of the 16th Pravasi Bhartiya diwas conference in 2021 called on contribution to self-reliant India.

NRI (Non Resident Indian)

Meaning of non-resident Indian citizens who are residents outside India and are citizens of India or who are an overseas citizens of India cardholders within the scope of section 7 (A)of the citizens Act 1955. According to the income tax act any Indian citizen who does not fulfill the criteria as a resident of India is not a resident of India and is deemed to be non-resident Indian and to pay income tax.

Person of Indian Origin

PIOA person of Indian origin means a foreign national excluding Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, China, Bhutan, Sri Lanka and Nepal that: -

(i) Be an Indian passport holder at any time or

(ii) Either he or both his parents or paternal grandparents wear born in India or be a permanent citizens of India before the government of India Act 1935 came into force or be a resident of any area after this period before it become an integral part of India.

An overseas citizen of India Keeping in mind the demand of the overseas Indians a citizenship scheme was created whereby overseas Indian citizens commonly known as OCI card holders. Acts to facilitate and enhance overseas investment as an agent of overseas change, accelerate industrial development and promote international trade and tourism. Money sent home by Migrants is one of the largest financial flows to developing countries. According to the world bank report India has retained its position as the world's top recipient with the highest number of remittances in the year 2018. Not only this, but many big multinational companies also have people of Indian origin in pivotal positions including Google, Microsoft, Pepsico etc.

The most important aspect is that India's permanent membership in the UNO Security Council can become a reality with the support of the Diaspora due to its rise in global status. India demonstrated its diplomatic influence by securing 2/3 in the United Nations for the reappointment of Justice Dalveer Bhandari to the international court of justice in November 2017. Having a large expatriate group also has intangible but important benefits of Migrant diplomacy. Historically also India has benefited it from its Diaspora whether it is in the form of remittances is sent from abroad or in the year 2008 the US- India civilian nuclear agreement bill has been successful in lobbying. The ministry of overseas Indian affairs has been established by the government of India in 2004 to solve the problem of the overseas Indian community. The objective of the scheme and programs run by the ministry of overseas Indian affairs is to i acquaint the migrant youth in the age group of 18 to 20 years with the development and achievements of the country and to connect them emotionally with their country of origin. Under the Pravasi Bhartiya Bima Yojna, a lite insurance of ¹ 10 lakhs is given to the nominee or official person on the death or disability of an overseas Indian who has gone abroad to get employment after getting permission to travel abroad. Mahatma Gandhi Pravasi Suraksha Yojna was launched on a pilot bases in Kerala on 1 May 2012 AD. The objective of this scheme is to promote and enable overseas Indian workers. Apart from this, the security of return and rehabilitation is to be held by the government in securing their pension and getting life insurance benefits in case of natural death.
